Two weeks before the group is due to meet, a film will be chosen that is readily available on a non-subscription service (usually BBC iPlayer or All4). Group members can watch the film at their leisure. We then meet via Zoom to discuss the film. Both iPlayer and All4 carry a significant number of non-mainstream and/or foreign language films, so we plan to explore some of the lesser-known film selections.
