The 'Bus meets the 10-17 a.m. North-Eastern and 10-41 a.m. Midland Railway trains; and arrives in Ilkley in the evening in time for the 6-0 Midland and 6-10 North-Eastern Railway trains. The journey is performed in one hour each way.

FARE FROM ILKLEY TO ABBEY AND BACK, 1/6.

To the STRID by the top road, from whence magnificent views are obtained of Upper Wharfedale, 2/- Seats may be booked by post.

The place of arrival is conveniently situated, being three minutes' walk from Fall of Route to the Strid; one mile to Barden Reservoir; one mile to Barden, from thence to the Meeting of the Waters, and Valley of Desolation; meeting at Abbey for return.

N.B.—The advantages of this route are: (1) Opportunities of a more careful observation of the beautiful scenery which environs the way. (2) Being set down at the Abbey, thereby avoiding having to walk a mile and a half on a hard limestone road, which, especially after a tiring ramble in the woods, it is most desirable to avoid.

SUNDAY—Leaves ILKLEY at 3 p.m., returning from Bolton at 6 for 7-10 North-Eastern train.
